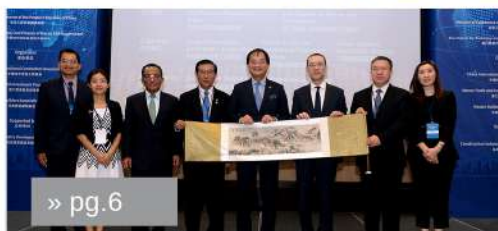

The meeting, held at Ministry of Human Resources' (MOHR) office in Putrajaya on 3 September was attended by President, Foo Chek Lee and Manager, Mohd Farhan. The meeting was chaired by MOHR's Deputy Secretary General (Policy & International), Datuk Kua Abun. TWGEW was one of the technical working groups of PEMUDAH. The PEMUDAH meetings are chaired by Chief Secretary to the Government, Datuk Seri Ismail Bakar, and co-chaired by Dato' Dr Ir Andy Seo Kian Haw.

PEMUDAH had tasked TWGEW to look into the foreign worker management system in Malaysia and, on Dato' Co-Chair's recommendation, the scope was widened to cover the employing of workers in general since the foreign workers issue has been on-going for years.

7th Seminar on Occupational Safety & Health (OSH) and Workshop on Fall Prevention in Sabah

The aim of MBAM 2-day OSH Seminar and Workshop on Fall Prevention held on 5 and 6 September was to provide platform for all construction OSH practitioners, project managers, business owners and consultants to share their expertise, knowledge, latest development and update related to OSH best practices in Malaysian construction industry. This seminar already in its 7th Year, was jointly organised by MBAM & Sabah Builders Association, with the support from Social Security Organisation (SOCO) and endorsed by Department of Occupational Safety & Health (DOSH) Malaysia and National Council of Occupational Safety & Health (NCOSH) Malaysia. Chairman of MBAM Safety & Health Committee, Michael Yap gave the Opening Remarks and President, Foo Chek Lee delivered the Welcome Remarks. The Guest of Honour, Tuan Haji Zulkifli Bin Yahaya, Director of DOSH Sabah officiated the seminar after his Opening Address. A press conference was held thereafter.

Overall, the seminar attracted a total of 96 participants from East Malaysia. Five papers were presented on the first day. The papers were as follows:

4. Sharing of OSH Best Practices – Precast Safety by Manager, Health, Safety & Environment (HSE), SP Setia Sdn Bhd, Kamarul Faezai Bin Salim; and
5. Overview Social Security Protection in Construction Industry by Director, SOCSO Sabah, Dr. Mohd Ali Bin Hindia.

The second day was a full day Workshop on Fall Prevention facilitated by Senior General Manager of Environmental, Safety & Health Department, Sunway Construction Sdn Bhd, Major (Rtd) Leong Yee Keong. The Launching of Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) Consultative Dialogue 2019

The launch was attended by MBAM Deputy Secretary-General 1, Ong Ka Thiam; Council Member, Tan Zi Ni and General Manager, Lenny Lim on 12 September at MITI Tower, Kuala Lumpur. Minister of International Trade and Industry, Datuk Darell Leiking welcomed attendees to the launching and said this year the event has 300 officials from 108 national and international chambers of commerce as well as business and industry associations in Malaysia. Overall, 54 memorandums, 379 issues were received and that is why MITI will have a one-month consultation period with the industry covering areas such as investment, market access and technology, labour, taxation, facilitation, logistics and infrastructure. The Minister said it was time for a rethinking of our trade, investment and industrial development policies. There is a need to rebuild Malaysia by promoting greater synergy between public and private sectors.

Deputy Minister of MITI, Dr Ong Kian Ming then gave a brief overview on investment, trade and industry initiatives. Overall, it was an interesting session which allowed for better networking between the public, private and NGO representatives to engage each other to further promote trade.

Workshop on Empowerment TVET – Technical (Industrial Cluster) – TVET Valued Industry Partner (VIP)

The Workshop was held on 12 September at Wisma FMM, Bandar Sri Damansara and was attended by MBAM Technical Director, Ir. Chuan Yeong Ming and Senior Assistant Manager, Muhammad Fadzley. TVET VIP is defined as an organisation that is committed and actively participating in the national TVET agenda by providing quality investment in human capital development through uplifting the public-private partnership.

During the workshop, there were several topics being discussed such as definition, categories, type of award, criteria of TVET VIP, the return value for the industry and its operational mechanism. TVET VIP will be awarded based on categories and by sectors with reference to Malaysian Standard Industry Classification [MSIC]. Categories are Government Link Company (GLC), Multinational Company (MNC), Small Medium Enterprise (SME), Listed Local Company (LLC) and Trade Associations.

Each sectors will be ranked and given the certification in three types of awards which are Platinum, Gold and Silver. The criteria for certification in 2019 are based on track records and generic standard while for the year 2020 onwards it will be based on detailed score basis. Company that participate actively will gain more publicity and enhance their corporate image. As a return value to the awarded organisations, the meeting has proposed the double tax deduction to the industry which significantly contribute to the national TVET agenda.

TVET VIP nomination can be done through TVET provider, trade associations or self-nomination for 2019. The selection committee will be represented by two persons per cluster. The nomination will be via online nomination form and there will be a promotion or roadshow to be conducted involving all stake holders.

Another issues being discussed related to TVET VIP and Industry cluster were coordination of timeline with other clusters, insufficient time to promote the TVET VIP in 2019, TVET intake issues in current examination system, coordination with the representatives of the TVET providers and to accelerate this TVET Technical Committee activities as one of our national TVET agenda. coordination with the representatives of the TVET providers and to accelerate this TVET Technical Committee activities as one of our national TVET agenda.

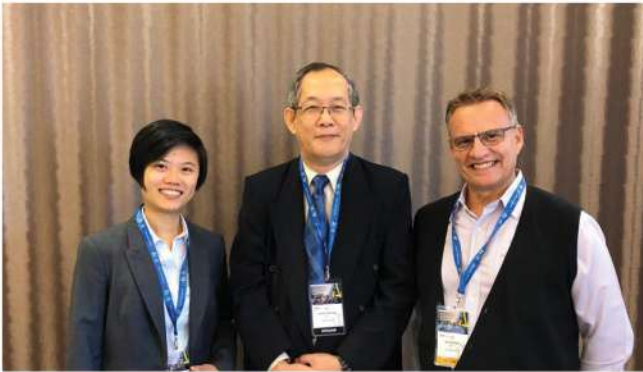

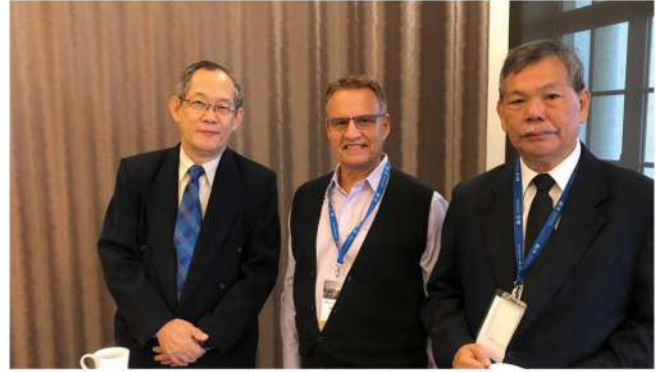

Construction 4.0: Bridging the Knowledge Gap

MBAM Contracts and Practices Committee Member, Lee Chee Yian presented on “The price you pay for not adapting – Contractor’s perspective” on behalf of MBAM on 17 September at Asian International Arbitration Centre. MBAM General Manager, Lenny Lim was also present at the talk. He began his presentation with a brief on how the whole world have embraced the Digital era since 80’s and now we are talking about big data and Artificial Intelligence (AI). For construction industry, we are referring to adoption of Building Information Modelling (BIM), use of scheduling and tendering softwares, etc. In the construction context, we are faced with the increasing incorporation of specialised equipment, components and services into buildings and infrastructures.

Lee also touched on current bad practices namely, lack of Pre-Tender planning, particularly in the preparation of Pre-Tender Schedule and Method Statements for the works. This resulted in industry disputes. Most of these disputes could be easily avoided or reduced if all parties could commit themselves to a good system of management and are sincere in resolving the differences. Lee ended by stating that we should spend the money and time in getting better work done, commit to timely delivery and maintaining good business relationship by investing in human resource and technologies.

Sharing Session to Introduce Employment Insurance System (EIS) Job Portal and Additional Services

The sharing session to introduce EIS Job Portal and additional services by SOCSO was held on 17 September at Wisma PERKESO, Kuala Lumpur and was attended by MBAM Vice President cum Chairman of HR Committee, Dennis Tan and Admin Officer, Sung Suet Yee.

Employment Enhancement Officer, Dianhazri Bin Rafie introduced the Public Employment Services (PES) which among the services provided are job search and match service, employability programmes, individual placement support and disability employment support. He emphasized on how the EIS can help those who lost their job in the Re-Employment Placement Programme and by providing financial assistance for a maximum period of six months.

The second session was a presentation by Employment Enhancement Officer, Mohd Sazuan Abdul Hadi that focused on the newly establish SOCSO Job Portal and the advantages of using the portal. Sazuan further explained on objective, function and method of EIS.

49th Building Industry Presidents' Council (BIPC) Meeting

President, Foo Chek Lee and Executive Director, Loh Mei Ling attended the 49th Building Industry Presidents' Council Meeting held on 26 September at the Association of Consulting Engineers Malaysia (ACEM) office at Menara 1MK, Mont Kiara, Kuala Lumpur.

Some of the issues and matters discussed were as follows:-

1. Human Resources Issues

- (a) Employment of foreign workers – the difficulties in getting Job Clearing System (JCS) due to noncompliance with labour laws as 70% of the companies failed the audit process. As such, MOHR is considering implementing a Social Compliance Audit for all companies wanting to employ foreign workers.
- (b) No more rehiring programme but can apply for replacement programme.
- (c) Back for Good programme is opened effective from 1 August 2019 till 31st December 2019 to provide the opportunity for foreigners who commit an offence under the Immigration Act 1959/63 to return home voluntarily. Compound payment of RM700 will be charged to foreigners who want to participate in this programme.
- (d) Employment of Bangladeshi will be reopened but yet to be announced by Government.
- (e) Multi-tier Levy System will be implemented by 1st January 2021.

2. TVET Empowerment Committee

MBAM is represented in several of the TVET Empowerment Committee – Governance Cluster; Quality Cluster; Industry Cluster; Funding Cluster; and Branding Cluster. The meeting has discussed the idea for better TVET which is a single TVET Governance Body. The meeting has also discussed and deliberated the TVET Empowerment Strategies such as to widen the scope and use of Industry Standard in the teaching methodology, to develop a policy and guideline on the TVET Certification like Code of Practice for TVET Programme Accreditation (COPTPA).

The National Council for Occupational Safety & Health (NCOSH) Construction Bureau successfully organised the seminar on 30 September at the Pearl Hotel, Kuala Lumpur which was supported by Department of Occupational Safety & Health (DOSH) Malaysia, Social Security Organisation (SOCSO) and MBAM. The Seminar was graced by Guest of Honour, Ir. Hj Omar Mat Piah, Director General of DOSH Malaysia.

Lifting operations are considered to be high-risk activities that require thorough risk assessment and careful planning prior to commencement of work. Managing occupational safety and health risks at the planning and design stage is often more effective, easier to sustain and cheaper to do than making changes later when the hazards become real risks in the workplace. The Guidelines on OSHCIM provides practical guidance to the client, designer and contractor on the management of safety, health and welfare when carrying out construction projects of a structure.
