The above meeting was held on 1 October at Ministry of Works (MOW) Tower and was attended by President, Foo Chek Lee and Manager, Mohd Farhan. The meeting was chaired by Secretary General, Ministry of Works, Dato' Dr. Syed Omar Sharifuddin Bin Syed Ikhsan.

The strategy paper for construction industry was presented by MOW which covered five thrusts namely; Quality, Safety & Professionalism, Environmental Sustainability, Productivity, Internationalisation and Facility Management. The feedback was gathered from each thrust and six main issues and challenges have been identified throughout the workshop which was previously conducted namely; project delivery, lifecycle performance, sustainability, affordability, disaster resilient and flexibility/liveability and wellbeing. In view of the relevancy of the report presented, the meeting agreed that the TWG/IAPG secretariat to forward the copy of the feedback to all members for review and comment.

The Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) Malaysia recognised the achievements of industry players at the prestigious MCIEA Awards 2019 who have demonstrated the elements of quality, safety and health, productivity and sustainability in their operations on 4 October at the W Hotel Kuala Lumpur.

The judging criteria had been revised to reflect a more holistic approach to encourage industry players to continue raising the standard of the Malaysian construction, in line with the ultimate goal of the CITP.

The awards ceremony was graced by the Minister of Works, YB Tuan Baru Bian. Also present were Deputy Minister of Works, Haji Mohd Anuar Mohd Tahir and Chairman of CIDB Malaysia, Tan Sri Dr. Ir. Ahmad Tajuddin Ali. Majority of MBAM Council Members including President, Foo Chek Lee; Deputy President, Tan Sri Sufri Hj. Mohd Zin and Immediate Past President, Datuk Matthew Tee were also present to witness the award presentations.

This year, MBAM members bagged some of the top awards at the said ceremony. Sunway Construction Sdn Bhd took home the coveted "Contractor of the Year Award", in recognition of their continuous outstanding achievements within the industry.

Construction industry captains honoured for their leadership and exemplary contributions were Executive Director of KLCC Projeks Sdn Bhd, Dato' Hashimah Hashim, who was awarded the "Construction Leading Lady Award" and MBAM Vice President, Dennis Tan Soo Huang the Managing Director of OCNED Water Technology Sdn Bhd was awarded the "CEO of the Year Award".

Construction Occupational Competency Development (COCD) Programme for Trade Supervisor (Foreman), Kuala Lumpur 12th Intake: Module 7 & 8

A total of 15 participants attended the training on module 7 and 8 of the COCD programme held on 8 October at MBAM Training Centre. These modules focused on site preparation and organisation, surveying and setting out as well as monitoring and supervising construction safety, health and environmental policies.

In module 7, participants were taught about the nature and types of construction project sites, site layout, preparation and control. Participants also learnt about planning for site preparation and organisation for construction trade foremen/supervisors, and site organisation and setting out for construction.

In module 8, participants explored and learnt about problems related to site safety and causes of accidents, planning and operation of safe working environment, environmental issues in construction projects and the effects of construction activities to the environment, CIS10 and CIS 25 on construction safety, health & environment issues for construction trade foremen/ supervisors.

The trainer for this session was Wong Khin Yip, while the assessors were Michael Thong and Dr Yeow Yoon Foo.

Datuk Matthew was the keynote speaker and presented on "Issues and Challenges in the Malaysian Construction Industry and the Road Forward".

The presentation touched on the brief outlook of the Malaysian economy before focussing into the realities of the construction industry and the chal-

In conclusion, Datuk Matthew suggested the industry to adopt new construction technologies such as BIM and digitised their processes to digitalisation and to improve IBS implementation. He hoped that the Government to reconsider reviving more projects and create new ones for the construction industry. A more competitive tenders was suggested and a need to prevent artificial inflation of prices. To improve competitiveness, the industry needs to organise more relevant trainings and simultaneously attract the new generation to enter the Malaysian construction industry.

At the end of the presentation, a memento of appreciation was presented to Datuk Matthew Tee by Lighthouse Club Kuala Lumpur's President, Ronan Collins.

6th MBAM Seminar on Occupational Safety & Health (OSH) and Workshop on Fall Prevention, Johor 2019

A 2-day Seminar on OSH and Workshop on Fall Prevention on 14 and 15 October was jointly organised with the Johore Master Builders Association (JMBA) ninety participants and guests attended the seminar that was held at Holiday Villa Johor Bahru City Centre, Johor.

This Seminar was supported by the Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) Malaysia and Social Security Organisation (SOCSO); and endorsed by National Council for Occupational Safety and Health (NCOSH) and Department of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH).



The seminar aimed to increase the productivity and efficiency of the construction industry by improving further the standard of amenities, facilities and quality of worksites environment while increasing awareness on the standard of safety and health at construction sites.

MBAM was honoured to have the Deputy Director General of DOSH Malaysia, Ir. Zailee bin Dollah as our Guest-of-Honour to officiate the seminar.

During the first day, five papers were presented with "Guidelines on Occupational Safety and Health in Construction Industry (Management) - OSHCIM 2017" by Deputy Director of Construction Safety of DOSH Malaysia, Ir. Mokhtar Sabtu being the first paper. Executive Officer of SOCSO, Muhammad Abrar Othman presented the second paper giving an outline on "Skim dan Faedah Perlindungan PERKESO Dibawah Akta dan Cara Permohonan yang Sebenar Untuk Tuntutan PERKESO". This was followed by Manager of CIDB Malaysia, Emasria Binti Ismail who spoke on the topic of "CIDB's Role in Promoting Safety in Construction Works and Culture in Construction Industry". Key Account Business Development Manager of Aerial Global Sdn Bhd, Alex Tan presented on the Safe Use of MEWPs at Works Place. His presentation focused on the importance of handling equipment correctly and emphasizes the importance of training. The last speaker for the day was Head of Occupational and Environment Health Sector, Disease Control Division from Ministry of Health Malaysia, Dr Priya Ragunath. Her presentation topic was "Workers Health, Dengue and Work Environment" whereby she focused on the importance of maintaining cleanliness at the work environment to prevent illness.

Based on feedbacks received, it is heartening to know that this two-full day seminar and workshop are beneficial for construction safety personnel.

MBAM Talk on Green Buildings, Greener Profits

On 15 October, MBAM Mechanical and Electrical Committee organised a "Talk on Green Buildings, Greener Profits". Mitchell Evan Gelber, the speaker who is a member of Malaysia's Green Building Index (GBI) in his presentation explore challenges and opportunities, myths and realities surrounding the cost of Malaysian green buildings. His talk also highlighted cost-effective design and construction practices as well as strategies for maximising green returns on investments.

Gelber explained the Green Building Index (GBI) launched on 21 May 2019 is Malaysia's industry recognised green rating tool for buildings to promote sustainability in the built environment and raise awareness among construction industry and the Public about environmental issues. The core reason for designing Green building is to reduce our consumption of natural resources, energy, water and waste. The benefit of a green building consume less energy, lower maintenance costs, higher occupant satisfaction and significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Representatives of Malaysian Senators' Council (MSC) comprising of its President, Dato' Sri Khairudin Bin E.S. Abd Samad; Special Officer to President, Chew Yoon Ee and Advisor to President, Yong Yee Coi visited MBAM on 16 October.

The meeting discussed on how to make the construction industry more efficient and not to waste valuable resources especially on processes that raises cost of doing business unnecessarily as well as long term unresolved issues such as unfair contract terms, improvements to the Construction Industry Payment and Adjudication Act (CIPAA) 2012, recruitment of workers and issues related to GST.

MBAM was represented by Immediate Past President, Datuk Matthew Tee; Vice President, Oliver Wee; Council Member, Datuk Astaman Abdul Aziz; and Secretariat.

Contracts & Practices Contract Administration Programme: Session 7 – Tender/Contract Documents and Obligations/Principles of Measurement and BQ Preparation and Value Management (VM)

MBAM held the 7th session of the 9 Sessions of Practical Construction Contract Administration/ Management on 16 October.

In general, the contract documents set out the obligations and responsibilities of the parties to the contract. Normally, on a traditionally-procured, fully-designed construction project, the contract documents for suppliers such as the main contractor are likely to include the following:

- a) Article of agreement and conditions of contract, for completing as a simple contract (or as a deed)
- b) Working drawings
- c) Bills of quantities
- d) Specifications

e) Schedules of work

In practice the administrative effort of collating all necessary paperwork can be overtaken by the desire to begin construction. In such circumstances it becomes harder to sort out any disputes as to the content. A tender on the other hand is a submission made by a prospective supplier in response to an invitation to tender. It makes an offer for the supply of goods or services. An invitation to tender might be issued for a range of contracts, including; equipment supply, the main construction contract (perhaps including design by the contractor), demolition, enabling works, etc. Construction contracts are meticulously created so that all the specifications are clearly defined. It is vital for contractors, owners, and designers to carefully consider the obligations.

Sr Ong Hock Tek also covered subject matters such as Principles of Measurement and BQ Preparation as well as Value Management. Overall, the event was very beneficial to the 36 participants that attended the programme.

Construction Occupational Competency Development (COCD) Programme for Trade Supervisor (Foreman), Kuala Lumpur 12th Intake: Module 9 and 10

The training on module 9 and 10 of the COCD programme held on 22 October at MBAM Training Centre was attended by a total of 15 participants. These modules focused on construction resource scheduling, inventory and wastage control as well as Project "S" Curve and baseline tracking for construction project monitoring and control.

In module 9, participants were able to learn about time versus resource constraint project planning and scheduling, resource allocation and utilisation in project execution for construction trade foremen/supervisors, resource inventory and store control for construction trade foremen/supervisors, and material handling and wastage control for construction trade foremen/supervisors.

In module 10, participants were taught about elements of effective construction project monitoring and control, project scheduling requirement for contract compliance and executive, Project "S" Curve and Earned Value Management (EVM) in project time and cost monitoring and control, as well as the changes, disruption and time control in project execution.

The trainer for this session was Dr Yeow Yoon Foo, while the assessors were Ho Chee Leong and Wong Khin Yip.

Being marked as a professional construction trade event, the MBAM OneBuild 2019 Exhibition was endorsed by Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation (MATRADE), for its international trade fair status, and it was fully supported by the Malaysian Government bodies such as Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) and Malaysian Investment Development Authority

MBAM OneBuild marked its 3rd successful editions this year and managed to attract international participations from countries including Singapore, China, Cambodia, Germany, France and Japan. There was an increased on the number of exhibitors from international participants, mainly from China with over 40 China companies participated to show case their products and services at this year's MBAM OneBuild.

The exhibition programmes also included free-admission industrial sharing sessions on Building Information Modelling (BIM) and Industrialised Building System (IBS) conducted by CIDB E-Construct Services Sdn Bhd and MIDA. Besides that, a "Concrete Clinic" was set up during the 3-day event to provide free consultancy on concrete related issues by the experts from American Concrete Institute Malaysia Chapter (ACI-Malaysia) as well as live demonstration on drone and concrete technology.

Other interesting activities included networking sessions, seminar on "Concrete Construction towards Digitalisation" by ACI- Malaysia, and various industrial sharing sessions by industry players.

MBAM MEWP Awareness Training (1st and 2nd Intake)

MBAM in collaboration with International Powered Access Federation (IPAF) organised the very first of Mobile Elevating Work Platforms (MEWPs) training for Members and industry players. This course was designed for personnel who are:

- Working in a broad range of industries such as construction, facilities management, retail and manufacturing.
- Supervisors who are responsible for planning and overseeing the safe use of MEWPs on their job sites.

The objectives of this training were to raise awareness to the participants on the current legislation, different types and classification of MEWPs, importance of correct machines selection, and to ensure the participants be able to select the correct PPE for the operators. It is hoped that after attending this session, participants will have a greater knowledge and awareness of the safe operation of MEWPs.



The 1st and 2nd intake were successfully completed on 29 October with 23 participants at Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre. The trainers for the training were IPAF Regional General Manager, Raymond Wat and representative, Alex Tan.

This Competency MEWPs training is recognised by DOSH and CIDB. Participating companies were given 10 CIDB CCD Points for each employee attending this training as well as 5 DOSH CEP Points for registered safety officer. Upon successfully completing the training, participants received MBAM and IPAF certificate of attendance and upon passing the theory test, participants will receive an additional "MEWPs for Manager" certificate from IPAF United Kingdom.
