## Discover Dhaka: Where History Meets Modernity

Dhaka, the capital of Bangladesh, is a vibrant and densely populated city known for its rich history, thriving culture, and dynamic energy. It blends ancient Mughal architecture and traditional markets with modern buildings and infrastructure. Key landmarks include Lalbagh Fort, Ahsan Manzil, Star Mosque, and the National Parliament House etc. Famous for its colorful rickshaws and diverse cuisine, Dhaka is also the country's main hub for politics, business, and culture, playing a vital role in national development.





## National Martyrs' Memorial, Savar

The National Martyrs' Memorial in Savar, 35 kilometers from Dhaka, is Bangladesh's iconic symbol of independence. It is the monument dedicated to the memory of those who died in the 1971 liberation war. Designed by Architect Syed Mainul Hossain and inaugurated in 1982, this striking monument commemorates the ultimate sacrifices made during the 1971 Liberation War. It's a seven triangular concrete structures, rising to 150 feet (46 meters), symbolize the seven stages of the nation's struggle for freedom, from the 1952 Language Movement to the 1971 victory. Set within 84 acres, the complex includes a reflecting pool, mass graves, and an eternal flame. Annually, on Victory Day (December 16) and Independence Day (March 26), thousands visit to pay their respects. It stands as a powerful symbol of national pride, resilience, and the enduring spirit of Bangladesh.



## **National parliament building:**

The Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban (National Parliament Building) in Sher-e-Bangla Nagar, Dhaka, is the home of Bangladesh's Parliament and one of the world's pleasing and largest legislative complexes, spanning 208 acres. It is a modernist masterpiece that blends geometric forms with local materials and cultural elements. Designed by the renowned architect Louis I. Kahn while Bangladesh was still East Pakistan, construction began in 1964. Kahn's design was commissioned to address disparities between East and West Pakistan. Construction halted during the 1971 Liberation War but resumed after independence in 1974, adhering to Kahn's original vision. Though Kahn passed away before its completion, the project was finalized by David Wisdom. The magnificent complex was officially completed on January 28, 1982, and is widely considered one of the twentieth century's most significant buildings.



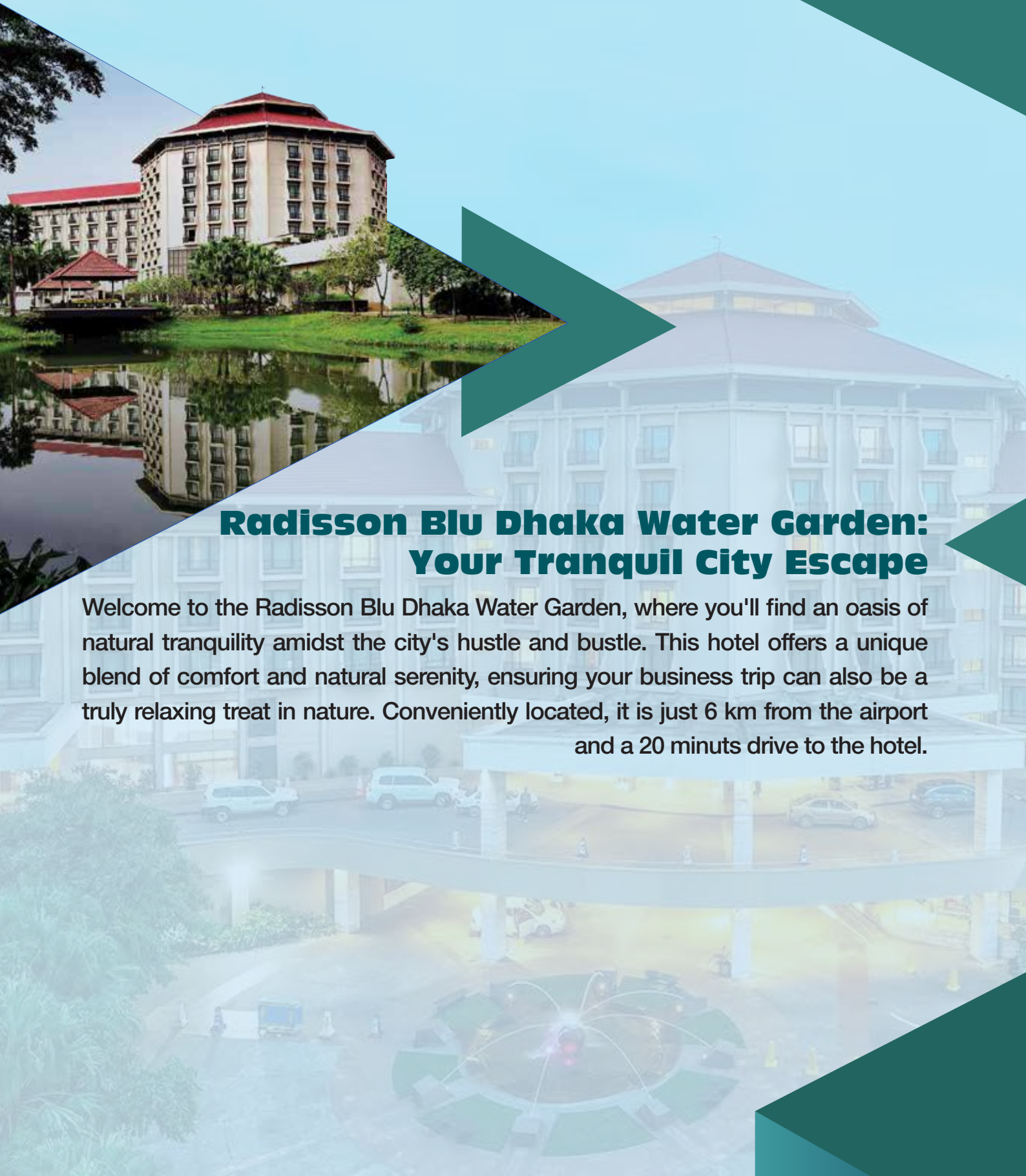
## National martyrs monument

National martyrs monument (The National Shaheed Minar) in central Dhaka, is a highly revered monument symbolizing Bangladesh's pride, resilience, and the historic Language Movement of 1952. It commemorates students and activists who gave their lives on February 21, 1952, demanding Bangla's recognition as a state language. The current design, created by sculptor Hamidur Rahman and architect Novera Ahmed and completed in 1963, features a central structure representing a mother with her fallen sons, surrounded by columns symbolizing unity. The red circular backdrop signifies the rising sun and the martyrs' blood. Every February 21, now observed globally as International Mother Language Day, thousands gather to pay homage. The Shaheed Minar remains a powerful emblem of the Bangladeshi people's right to identity, language, and cultural freedom.



## **Curzon Hall: A Legacy of Architecture and Language**

Curzon Hall, a distinguished British Raj-era building in Shahbagh, Dhaka, houses the Faculty of Sciences at the University of Dhaka. Originally intended as a town hall, its foundation stone was laid in 1904 by Lord Curzon, after whom it is named. Funded by the Bhawal Estate princes, it was completed in 1908. Its significance grew with the 1905 Partition of Bengal, making Dhaka a provincial capital. After the partition's abolition in 1911, Dhaka College held classes there. In 1921, it became part of the University of Dhaka's science department. Critically, Curzon Hall played a pivotal role in the Bengali Language Movement (1948-1956), where students famously protested the decision to make Urdu the sole state language in 1948, asserting the importance of Bangla.
